The Celebrant pronounces the Absolution over the People.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:1-10

- 14. Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. 15. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize
- with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. 16. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
- **5.1** For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. **2.** He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. **3.** Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people. **4.** And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was. **5.** So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; **6.** as he says also in another place,

"You are a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek."

7. In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. 8. Although he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. 9. And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, 10. being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchizedek. (ESV)

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. **21.** So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." **22.** Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. **23.** And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. **24.** Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. **25.** Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. **26.** If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him. **27.** "Now is my soul troubled.

And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. 28. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." 29. The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." 30. Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not mine. 31. Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. **32.** And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." 33. He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die. 34. So the crowd answered him, "We have heard from the Law that the Christ remains forever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?" 35. So Jesus said to them, "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you. The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. 36. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light." (ESV)

Sermon

Nicene Creed (People stand)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible. 

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen*.

And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but

deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


